Searching for Articles Only

Go to <http://www.library.pitt.edu> and select "Find Articles." At the Zoom! screen, select the category for Psychology or select the following databases:

Academic Search Premier: Full text scholarly journal and popular articles

HAPI (Health and Psychosocial Instruments): Provides ready access to information measurement instruments (citations, abstracts, no full text)

PsycCRITIQUES: A source for full text reviews of psychology literature. Reviews of popular films and trade books from a psychological perspective are also included.

PsycEXTRA: A collection of conference papers, newsletters and annual reports not included in PsycINFO

PsycINFO (via Ovid): Covers academic, research, and practice literature in psychology as well as relevant material from related disciplines with citations and abstracts

Searching for E-journals

Go to <http://www.library.pitt.edu> and select “E-Journals.” Then type the desired journal title; e.g. “American Journal of Psychology”
