### CHILDREN'S LITERATURE CONFERENCE


The 15th annual Pitt-Greensburg Children's Literature Conference will be held on Friday, May 6, 2011. Authors Rickard Peck and Jim Aylesworth will be the featured speakers.

Richard Peck has written over 30 novels. Peck won the Newbery medal (A Year Down Yonder), a Newbery Honor (A Long Way from Chicago), the Margaret A.

Edwards Award, the Scott
O'Dell Award (*The River*Between Us), the Christopher
Medal (*The Teacher's*Funeral), and the Edgar
Award twice. Peck has also
been a finalist for the
National Book Award twice.

Jim Aylesworth is a picture book author and teacher whose works include *Our Abe Lincoln, The Gingerbread Man, Old Black Fly,* and *The*  Mitten. Aylesworth has won several teaching awards, including two from the Illinois Board of Education and Concordia University's Alumnus of the Year.



#### FEATURED MOVIES IN THE LIBRARY

The Social Network, the story of the founding of Facebook, is now available on DVD in the Millstein Library. The film won four Golden Globes, including Best Motion Picture, Best Director, Best Original Score, and Best Screenplay.

Jesse Eisenberg stars as Harvard student Mark Zuckerberg, who had the idea for Facebook in 2003 during his undergraduate years. The film presents the story through flashbacks from deposition hearing for two lawsuits, showing how Facebook grew from one college campus to a global social network. Zuckerberg gains and loses friends, overcomes legal challenges,

and becomes a billionaire in the process.

The Social Network was directed by David Fincher (Seven, Fight Club, Zodiac), and includes a mostly unknown cast. Check it out and learn the background of one of the world's most popular websites.
