ARCHIVES DISPLAY



A new archives display greets patrons at the entrance to the Millstein Library. The "H2PG" display features Pitt football buttons and other Pitt artifacts from the past 30 years that are normally kept in the Millstein Library archives.




LIBRARY UPDATES

First (at right), a new area for wireless mobile devices has been added on the first floor of the library near the periodical room. The area features tables, chairs, and power strips for charging laptops, tablets, and other mobile devices.
