In terms of getting help from a librarian, we are so excited to be fully staffed this semester. New librarians Kelly Bradish and Amanda Miller have joined our team, and we are already seeing great things from the two of them.

We've also implemented online scheduling for making research appointments with a librarian (see http://pitt.libguides.com/ ateam). Students and faculty can view our availability in real time and schedule an appointment when it's most convenient for them.

We're also going to be piloting extended/modified hours for the last week of classes and the beginning of finals, so that students have more options for finishing up their assignments and studying. In terms of object creation, we provided members of our campus with 44 free posters and 806 free color prints in the fall semester! —Amanda Folk

Samantha's display featured books and DVDs from a variety of winter holidays.




Amanda's display featured books of poetry including works from the Pitt-Greensburg faculty.
