FEATURED MOVIES IN THE LIBRARY

Winner of six Academy Awards including Best Picture and Best Director (Kathryn Bigelow), *The Hurt Locker* is now available in the Millstein Library.

The film tells the story of a U.S. Army bomb squad unit in Iraq with a month left in their tour of duty. When one member of the team is killed by an IED, Staff Sergeant William James (Oscar nominee Jeremy Renner) joins the team.

With his reckless and thrillseeking attitude, James dismantles many bombs but angers his team members. James is there for the druglike high that he gets from overcoming the challenge and danger of defusing bombs. He is also totally bored by his wife and child at home. The film turns out to be a fascinating character study enhanced by Renner's excellent performance.

The supporting cast include Guy Pearce, Ralph Fiennes, Anthony Mackie, David Morse, and Evangeline Lilly.
